ORDER OF PROHIBITION FROM FURTHER PARTICIPATION

KENNON R. PATTERSON, SR. ("Respondent") has received a

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PROHIBIT FROM FURTHER PARTICIPATION

("NOTICE") issued by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation

("FDIC") detailing the unsafe or unsound banking practices,

and/or breaches of fiduciary duty for which an ORDER OF

PROHIBITION FROM FURTHER PARTICIPATION ("ORDER") may issue, and

has been further advised of the right to a hearing on the alleged

charges under section 8(e) of the Federal Deposit Insurance Act

("Act"), 12 U.S.C. § 1818(e), and the FDIC's Rules of Practice

and Procedure, 12 C.F.R. Part 308. Having waived those rights,

Respondent entered into a STIPULATION AND CONSENT TO THE ISSUANCE

OF AN ORDER OF PROHIBITION FROM FURTHER PARTICIPATION ("CONSENT

AGREEMENT") with a representative of the Legal Division of the

FDIC, whereby, solely for the purpose of this proceeding and

without admitting or denying any unsafe or unsound banking practices, and/or breaches of fiduciary duty, Respondent consented to the issuance of an ORDER by the FDIC.

The FDIC considered the matter and determined it had reason to believe that:

- (a) the Respondent has engaged or participated in unsafe or.
 unsound banking practices, and/or breaches of fiduciary duty
 while an institution-affiliated party of COMMUNITY BANK,
 BLOUNTSVILLE, ALABAMA ("Bank");
- (b) by reason of such unsafe or unsound banking practices, and/or breaches of fiduciary duty, the Bank has suffered financial loss or other damage and/or Respondent received financial gain or other benefit; and
- (c) such unsafe or unsound banking practices, and/or breaches of fiduciary duty involve personal dishonesty on the part of Respondent and/or demonstrate Respondent's willful and/or continuing disregard for the safety or soundness of the Bank.

The FDIC further determined that such unsafe or unsound banking practices, and/or breaches of fiduciary duty demonstrate Respondent's unfitness to serve as a director, officer, person participating in the conduct of the affairs or as an institution-affiliated party of the Bank, any other insured depository institution, or any other agency or organization enumerated in section 8(e)(7)(A) of the Act, 12 U.S.C. § 1818(e)(7)(A).

The FDIC, therefore, accepts the CONSENT AGREEMENT and issues the following:

ORDER OF PROHIBITION FROM FURTHER PARTICIPATION

- 1. KENNON R. PATTERSON, SR., is hereby, without the prior written approval of the FDIC and the appropriate Federal financial institutions regulatory agency, as that term is defined in section 8(e)(7)(D) of the Act, 12 U.S.C. § 1818(e)(7)(D), prohibited from:
- (a) participating in any manner in the conduct of the affairs of any financial institution or organization enumerated in section 8(e)(7)(A) of the Act, 12 U.S.C. § 1818(e)(7)(A);
- (b) soliciting, procuring, transferring, attempting to transfer, voting, or attempting to vote any proxy, consent or authorization with respect to any voting rights in any financial institution enumerated in section 8(e)(7)(A) of the Act,

 12 U.S.C. § 1818(e)(7)(A);
- (c) violating any voting agreement previously approved by the appropriate Federal banking agency; or
- (d) voting for a director, or serving or acting as an institution-affiliated party.
- 2. This ORDER will become effective upon its issuance by the FDIC. The provisions of this ORDER will remain effective and enforceable except to the extent that, and until such time as any provision of this ORDER shall have been modified, terminated,

suspended, or set aside by the FDIC.
